The NP110N04PUK is N-channel MOS Field Effect Transistor designed for high current switching applications.






TEST CIRCUIT 2 SWITCHING TIME




TEST CIRCUIT 3 GATE CHARGE

DERATING FACTOR OF FORWARD BIAS SAFE OPERATING AREA




TOTAL POWER DISSIPATION vs. CASE TEMPERATURE





FORWARD BIAS SAFE OPERATING AREA





TRANSIENT THERMAL RESISTANCE vs. PULSE WIDTH








 T_{ch} - Channel Temperature - $^{\circ}\text{C}$

DRAIN TO SOURCE ON-STATE RESISTANCE vs. DRAIN CURRENT




FORWARD TRANSFER CHARACTERISTICS





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DRAIN TO SOURCE ON-STATE RESISTANCE vs. GATE TO SOURCE VOLTAGE








DRAIN TO SOURCE ON-STATE RESISTANCE vs. CHANNEL TEMPERATURE




SWITCHING CHARACTERISTICS



SOURCE TO DRAIN DIODE FORWARD VOLTAGE




CAPACITANCE vs. DRAIN TO SOURCE VOLTAGE





DYNAMIC INPUT/OUTPUT CHARACTERISTICS





REVERSE RECOVERY TIME vs. DRAIN CURRENT




Package Drawing (Unit: mm)

Equivalent Circuit



Remark: Strong electric field, when exposed to this device, can cause destruction of the gate oxide and ultimately degrade the device operation. Steps must be taken to stop generation of static electricity as much as possible, and quickly dissipate it once, when it has occurred.
